


Wurden Themen durch Beispiele veranschaulicht?




Wurden die Themen ausführlich genug erklärt?



War die Struktur der Vorlesung klar zu erkennen?














Der Praxisbezug war...




Ist der Arbeitsaufwand für dieses Modul im Hinblick auf die LP-Zahl angemessen?










Die Schwierigkeit der Übungsblätter schwankte...








Die Übungsaufgaben waren meistens...



7.1 Was hat dir an dieser Lehrveranstaltung gefallen?

- The lecture was very good
- good lecture structure, division into session with a summary each
- use case examples were given for every method/topic that was introduced

One of the best lectures at the university.

Examples were very interesting and the lecture was well structured and taught very nicely.

7.2 Was könnte noch besser gemacht werden?

The professor talks fast, teaches a lot, and uses complex vocabulary (both in lectures and slides). Managing to cover all the topics for the exam is exhausting. This course could be split into two 6-credit courses.

The exercise session and the exercise task overall can be improved:

- Not every chapter was covered in the exercises:
- The last 3 chapters: Chapter 14, 15 and 16 were not covered at all, not even in the test exam
- Chapter 13 was covered in one task only (the last task on the last sheet, vortex paper reading)
- This makes me feel like I am not prepared for the kind of questions the exam might have about those topics therefore at the end the lecture was ahead of the exercises.
- In general I do not think the exercise prepares me for the exam.

- In general I feel like the exercise was more application of certain visualizations/tools and reading papers and not a deeper dive into the lectures topic. I could compute the gradient and magnitude of an image and visualize it as histogram with matplotlib and vtk package, without knowing that I am coding a transfer function.

- The paper reading was tedious and I saw it as an extension of the lecture. I wish we would have covered more of the theoretical topics of the lecture and instead maybe left the paper reading as bonus task for those who need points or need to present.

- I feel like the lecture covers very much content and it is much content to learn by hard for the exam. But I think this feeling is created by the exercises which did not cover enough of the lecture.
