6.1 Kommentar

The lecturer gives motivational introductions and practical application examples for the topics. His interest in teaching students about the topics is clearly observable.

the lecturer put in so much effort and passion in his lecture topics and went above and beyond with the making a simple yet elegant examples during the course to strongly aid the understanding of the topic related. showing how much passion he puts in his lecture is motivating and the lecture itself was quite enjoyable with no downtime. 7.1 Was hat dir an dieser Lehrveranstaltung gefallen?

the lectures were very organized, they were quite interesting and straight to the point, the examples were clear and detailed, the way the professor teaches the lecture makes you engaged during the full 90 mins, a good amount of theoretical and practical information for the related topics, the professor got a clear passion for this field and it is shown during his lecture and his effort in the lecture slides and the assignments. the ability to help you think through the problem and ease you into the solution. Everything was great.

7.2 Was könnte noch besser gemacht werden?

The lecturer was consistently impolite and emanated a disregard for students and their studies. Examples:

- The lecturer said that 75% of us are stupid.
- After being asked a question during the lecture, whether a technique could be applied to a particular practical example, the lecturer answered the question, but not without making clear that he hates this example.
- In one lecture, he complained that after the previous lecture, students approached him with questions, which he perceived should have been answered by visiting other lectures.
- I don't remember a single lecture where the lecturer didn't bad-mouth reinforcement-learning-bloggers.

This impoliteness made the whole lecture unpleasant, made me feel unwelcome, and made it difficult to follow the lecture.

there is not much to improve, but if i can be slightly nitpicking I would probably just say when usually another student asks a question during, sometimes the student voice is not as loud as the lecturer voice, so sometimes If the student is a bit far from the place you are sitting you are unable to hear the question clearly, so It would be great if the professor could repeat the question for all of us to hear before answering it. but thats just me being nitpicky and there is nothing else that comes to mind to be improved.
